BRACU 5th Convocation



BRAC University 5th convocation was held on February 7, 2010 at the Bangabandhu International Conference Centre. Mr. Md. Zillur Rahman, Chancellor, BRAC University chaired the convocation program. Professor Martha Alter Chen and Professor Linclon Chen, Harvard University, USA addressed the program as the convocation speakers.

Education Minister Mr. Nurul Islam Nahid, MP and Professor Nazrul Islam, Chairman of University Grants Commission were present at the function as special guests. Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury, Vice Chancellor, BRAC University delivered the welcome address. Sir Fazle Hasan Abed, Founder and Chairperson, BRAC and President, BRAC University Governing Board also delivered his speech in the convocation ceremony. Among others, students, guardians, faculty members, staff, ambassadors and others distinguished guests also attended the convocation ceremony. The convocation program began with the National Anthem and BRAC University anthem at 11.30 AM and concluded with closing speech by Vice Chancellor Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury at 2.00 PM.

With a mission of fostering the national development process through the creation of a 'Centre of Excellence' in higher education that is responsive to society's needs and able to develop creative leaders and

actively contributes to learning and creation of knowledge, the BRAC University started its journey in 2001. Now the university has nine faculties under its undergraduate program and another nine faculty under its postgraduate program.

A total of 563 students including 387 in undergraduate and 176 in postgraduate were given certificates in the 5th convocation.

Professor Dr. Anisuzzaman, Mr. Faruque Ahmed Choudhury, Professor Ainun Nishat also addressed the farewell ceremony.

Professor Golam Samdani Fakir in his speech said Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury (JRC) has turned the BRACU into one of the few leading and high quality private universities in the country by virtue of his dynamic leadership, time befitting guidance, well strategic plan and innovative knowledge in running an organization. Terming Jamilur Reza Choudhury a self-enlightened person, Professor Samdani said not only he himself is a great personality but also has made many to be great with his sublime touch.

Dr. Anisuzzaman said Professor JRC has a special quality through which he can easily interact with others and attract them towards him. CRBLP Research Wins BASIS IT Innovation Search Award in SOFTEXPO 2010



Katha - a CRBLP-developed software to translate Bangla text to speech was chosen as the Best Innovative Project during BASIS SOFTEXPO 2010. Bangladesh Association of Software and Information Services (BASIS), the national trade Association of software and IT enabled services companies of Bangladesh, recently held its annual exposition BASIS SOFTEXPO 2010 at the Bangabandhu International Conference Centre. One of the major events at the expo this year was an IT Innovation Search Program designed to discover and reward local innovations in IT. The BASIS jury had selected 3 finalists, two of which were BRACU CRBLP research outputs, to highlight during the expo. The other finalist from CRBLP was Bangla OCR (Optical

Character Recognition) software that can convert images of printed Bangla text to editable text. The Katha research team consists of Firoj Alam, S. M. Murtoza Habib, Kamrul Hayder and Naira Khan; the Bangla OCR team consists of Md. Abul Hasnat, Muttakinur Rahman Chowdhury, S. M. Murtoza Habib and Dil Afroza Sultana. Professor Mumit Khan, Head of the Centre for Research on Bangla Language Processing (CRBLP), received the award on behalf the CRBLP research team at the ceremony.

Open Source Library Management System KOHA at BRACU

KOHA, the first and most advanced Open Source Integrated Library System (ILS) in the world, was launched at BRAC University Ayesha Abed Library on February 24, 2010.

Professor Nazrul Islam, Chairman, University Grants Commission (UGC) was present as chief guest. Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury, Vice Chancellor, BRACU, Professor Dr. Md. Golam Samdani Fakir, Pro VC, BRACU and Professor Dr. Mumit Khan (Advisor of ILS Project), Chairperson, Dept. of Computer Science and Engineering addressed the function. While inaugurating KOHA, Professor Nazrul Islam praised the initiatives taken by the BRACU to establish an Integrated Library System (ILS) and trained up library professionals in order to build capacities for other universities. He mentioned that BRAC University has gained the capacity for conducting training for library professionals, which is certainly appreciable.

Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury ranked KOHA as a sophisticated 21st century modern ILS because of its excellent features and characteristics. He expressed his opinion that UGC may consider KOHA for any future project of university libraries. Professor Md. Golam Samdani Fakir, while delivering the welcome address, mentioned that the main purpose of the project was to implement a complete library automation system and develop BRACU as local resource, and in turn helps to build capacity in other libraries who may want to move to automation using KOHA

BRAC University Ayesha Abed Library has successfully completed the project "Creating an Integrated Library System (ILS) using Open Source Software KOHA" with funds from Elsevier Foundation, UK. BRAC University was one of the four universities selected by Elsevier from among 165 applicants from different countries to receive funding for this project Library professionals from different universities and institutes participated in the ceremony. Deputy Librarian Ms Hasina Afroz made a presentation on "Implementation of an open source library management system KOHA: BRAC University experience" in the function.

BRACU Writing Centre Launched

BRACU Writing Centre officially launched on February 28, 2010. The ceremony was honored by the presence and words of BRACU Vice Chancellor Professor Jamilur Reza Choudhury and Pro-Vice Chancellor

The Writing Centre has been established to support the entire BRAC University community of faculty and students in all stages of the writing process. BDI Update

Resource Person Maitrayee Mukhopadhyay visits

Maitrayee Mukhopadhyay, from the Royal Tropical Institute (KIT) visited the Pathways Programme from 31st January to 5th February in order to conduct interviews with donors as part of the Mobilizing Resources

for Women's Empowerment Research. During her visit, the team met with key members of several organizations- Manusher Jonno, IOM, Oxfam, Danida, CIDA, ADB, Norwegian Embassy, Netherlands Embassy and The Asia Foundation. The researchers conducted these interviews in order to learn about the mission of the organizations, the history and goals of its funding strategies and development agendas, and the way they choose to allocate the resources they have.

Data Analyses of Mobilizing Resources Research

The Mobilizing Resources for Women's Empowerment Project under the Pathways Programme was engaged with data analyses during the month of February. The team undertook transcription and analyses of the interviews conducted with the various organizations of their research- Banchte Shekha, Kormojibi Nari, BNWLA and BOMSA. They also gathered official and financial documents of these organizations to note the organizational changes over time.

Discussion on 'Masculinity in Transition: Education, Colonialism and Nation at Aligarh Muslim University'

The Cultural History Research at the Pathways Programme invited Amber Abbas, PhD candidate in the Department of History at the University of Texas at Austin, USA to share aspects of her research on South Asian history. Ms. Abbas traced how ideas of masculinity in 19th Century Britain were entrenched in the ethos of Aligarh Mulsim University, analysed the colonial and national politics played out inside and around the site of the University in the decades between 1930-1950, and analysed how notions of gender expounded by the University shaped the of state-making of Pakistan.

Launching of research booklets at Ekushey Boi Mela

The Pathways Programme at BDI launched four of its research reports in Bangla at the Ekushey Book Fair. The publications were launched by Dr. Imran Matin, Deputy Executive Director of the BRAC Africa Programmes, on 20th February, 2010 at the 'Nazrul Moncho' on the grounds of the Bangla Academy.

The reports are available through the University Press Limited (UPL) and at the BDI office at BRAC University.

Appearance on Desh TV

Aanmona Priyadarshini appeared on Desh TV on Friday, 26th February, during its coverage of the Ekushey Boi Mela. She spoke to the media outlet about the four BDI publications that were based on the researches conducted by the Pathways of Women's Empowerment Programme.

Postponement of research in the CHT

The Digital Story Workshop that was scheduled to be held in Rangamati during 23-27 February had to be postponed last minute due to the violence and political instability in the Hill Tract region. The visit by Amena Mohsin, Lead Researcher of the Women and Security Research project of the Pathways Programme, to the CHT also had to be postponed.

Field research on sex preferences of women

The IDRC-supported research on 'Re-Visiting Devaluation of Daughters in Bangladesh' carried out field work in Komorpur and Faridpur during the month of February. The primary data collection included individual interviews, a census and sex preference surveys.

Citizenship Rights Fair (Nagorik Adhikar Mela) Dialogue

A Nagorik Adhikar Mela Dialogue was held on February 28th 2010 with the 57 organisations who took part in the Fair to strategise on building future networks.

Financial Services for the Poor: An Introduction

A fourteen-day introductory course on microfinance started on February 25th. This course is intended for those with little or no knowledge of microfinance. There are 21 participants from Japan attending this course. It provides a broad global picture on the state of microfinance, its emergence and challenges and its future. It will be grounded in the experience of Bangladesh. The certificate distribution ceremony will be held on Monday March 8th at 5:30 pm at the BRAC Centre Auditorium.

Courses: Bangladesh Studies and Ethics and Culture

BDI is now managing a course on Ethics and Culture and a course on Bangladesh Studies for BRAC University. Currently BDI is in charge of designing and ground-testing the two courses.


Lisa Ponzetti conducted two workshops: 'Using Legos to Explore the Learning Experience'

Professor Anis Chowdhury, University of Western Sydney, Australia, and Dr Mustafizur Rahman, Executive Director, CPD came to the Department of Economics and Social Sciences as guest lecturers to lecture on "Monetary Policy and Exchange Rate Issues" and "WTO Doha Round Negotiations and Bangladesh Trade Policy: Issues of Interest, and Strategies" respectively on two consecutive seminars held on February 1 and 9, 2010 organized for the students of PGDMA (Post Graduate Diploma in Macroeconomic Analysis).

Research Outcome

A working paper on "Prevalence and Costs of Childhood Diarrhoea in the Slums of Dhaka" written by M. Jahangir Alam, Senior Lecturer, ESS Department, BRAC University was published by the South Asian

Network for Development and Environmental Economics (SANDEE) on February 2010. This study seeks to identify the engineering, behavioural and socio-economic determinants of childhood diarrhoea and its duration and to compute the resulting costs borne by slum dwellers. The study suggests that more focus on water storage and hand washing in NGO and media campaigns and more concerted efforts by the state to provide clean water 24 hours a day to slum communities would go a long way towards controlling the incidence of childhood diarrhea. Department of ESS organized the visit for the students of Spring 2010. The purpose of the visit was to inform students about the rural people of Bangladesh and their lives and livelihoods. Students spent the whole day with the villagers and shared their experiences.

The Campus Superintendent, Coordinator of Bangladesh Studies, faculty members of ESS, CfL. Counselors and house tutors of TARC, Savar accompanied the students.

Visit to Liberation War Museum & Rayer Bazar Boddho-Bhumi

On February 20 & 28, 2010 a total of 202 students of Bangladesh Studies (DEV101) and Bangladesh History, Culture and Society (SOC 102), Savar Residential Semester went to visit Liberation War Museum and Rayer Bazaar Boddho Bhumi, Dhaka, as part of their academic activities. Department of ESS organized the visits for the students of Spring 2010.

Students were informed about the importance of liberation war in 1971 and it's perspectives by visiting galleries and watching documentary movie. Coordinator of Bangladesh Studies, faculty members of ESS & CfL, counselors and house tutors of TARC, Savar accompanied the students.

IGS Update

IGS offered technical assistance to the Central Procurement Technical Unit (CPTU) of the Government of Bangladesh in holding the first of the Public-Private Stakeholders Committee (PPSC) meetings in February 2010. The meeting was held on 03 February 2010 in the NEC Conference Room 02 of the Planning Commission Campus in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar. Air vice Marshal (Rtd.) A K Khandker, Honourable Minister, Ministry of Planning and Chairperson of the Public-Private Stakeholders Committee (PPSC), chaired the meeting. The PPSC is formed under the auspices of Public Procurement Reform Project - II (PPRP-II), which is funded by the World Bank, to create citizen engagement in public procurement processes in Bangladesh, consists of representatives from academia, business community, think-tanks and civil society organizations along with government officials. Twenty-three out of twenty seven PPSC members (or their representatives) attended the meeting.

Journalism Training and Research Initiatives (JATRI) of IGS organized a lecture on "Broadcast Journalism: Past, Present and Way Forward" at JATRI premises on Thursday, 04 February 2010. Prominent broadcaster of Voice of America (VOA), Mr. Anis Ahmed was the key speaker. The lecture was followed by a questionanswer session. Senior journalists, media professionals, academic from the University of Dhaka were also present.

A daylong event titled "Review Reflection" was organized by JATRI on 17 February 2010 at BRAC Centre for Development Management, Rajendrapur, Gazipur. The objectives were to get feedback/suggestions from the participants who attended the trainings organized by JATRI so far and to know how they have applied it stheir work. JATRI Training Unit has organized 9 trainings so far where 150 participants from various media houses in Bangladesh attended. Mr. Abdur Rahman, Senior Faculty Member of BRAC Training Division facilitated the event. Some of the suggestions that came out from the participants for further improvement of JATRI included things like offering fellowships, declaring annual awards, organizing trainings abroad, and offering long course for the journalists etc.

Mr. Manzoor Hasan, Director of IGS visited Bangkok, Thailand from 1-3 February 2010 to participate in the Regional Community of Practice meeting on Anti-Corruption. The meeting focused on United Nations

Convention against Corruption (UNCAC) Compliance Reviews and also included a half-day ethics training. The workshop was primarily organized to launch a Regional Consortium that will support UNCAC Compliance Reviews in 6 countries in 2010, namely Bhutan, Lao PDR, Mongolia, Sri Lanka, Palau and Solomon Islands. The main objectives of the meeting were to a) Share lessons learned on how to conduct UNCAC Gap Analyses, processes, outputs and outcomes; b) Review a draft Guidance Note on how to conduct UNCAC Gap Analyses; c) Provide a platform for Regional Consortium partners and national counterparts to meet prior to launching the nationally led UNCAC Gap Analysis process.

As a follow-up of this meeting, Mr. Manzoor Hasan also visited Bhutan from February 26-27, 2010 to provide technical assistance to the government of Bhutan in developing a Guidance Note to conduct UNCAC Compliance Review.

MNS Update

MNS Seminar

Mrs. Fardousi Ara Begum, Lecturer of Mathematics at the Department of Mathematics & Natural Sciences (MNS) gave a seminar entitled "Solving one-dimensional heat equation by control volume-method and then comparison with the exact solution" on Thursday, 4 February 2010, at 09.30 am in the Conference Room (UB 1521). The seminar talk was based on the control volume method for the derivation of discretization equations. The heat conduction equation is based on energy conservation principle when the discretization equations are derived by the control-volume method; they represent the conservation of energy, momentum, mass etc. for each control volume. It has been shown that the resulting numerical solution correctly satisfies the conservation of these quantities over the whole calculation domain. Faculty members of MNS and other departments and some students attended the seminar.

Fifth Convocation of BRACU and Award of Bachelor of Science Degree in Physics

The 5th Convocation of BRACU was held at the Bangabandhu International Conference Centre on 7 February 2010. SOFTEXPO 2010: Seminar on Role of IT in Policy Formulation on Climate Change Adoption in Bangladesh

Professor Naiyyum Choudhury participated on invitation as a special guest in the seminar on IT and Climate Change, held at the Hall of Harmony, Bangabandhu International Conference Centre, Dhaka, organized by the Bangladesh Association of Software & Information Services. The theme of the seminar was ICT Capability and Climate Change- Bangladesh Perspectives. Professor Dr. Syed Modaasser Ali, Advisor to the Hon'ble Prime Minister on Health and Family and Social Welfare was the Chief Guest and Mr. Mihir Kanti Majumder, Secretary, Ministry of Environment and Forest GOB was the Special Guest. The seminar covered issues like vulnerability of Bangladesh to climate change, present climate change scenario, consequences of climate change in Bangladesh, induced impacts of climate change, feasible adaptation measures for Bangladesh and how information and communication technology capacity in Bangladesh can support in adopting climate changes. Professor Choudhury emphasized the need for strong public- private partnership for meeting the challenges of climate change and urged upon the BASIS to render their IT skills and expertise in implementing different programmes and activities of the government to cope with the adverse situation of climate change in the coming days.

Seminar on Arsenic Problem and its Mitigation

Professor Naiyyum Choudhury participated in the above-mentioned seminar on Arsenic Problem and its Mitigation, organized by the Bangladesh Academy of Sciences and held at the Atomic Energy Centre, Dhaka on 14 February 2010. Professor Naiyyum Choudhury moderated the seminar and highlighted the present status of arsenic mitigation work in Bangladesh.

18th Meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Committee on Science and Technology (ECNCST

February 2010 at the Ministry of Science and ICT, GOB and chaired by Architect Yeafesh Osman, State Minister, Ministry of Science and ICT. It may be mentioned that a 51 member National Committee on Science and Technology was formed on 28 July 2009 by the Hon'ble Prime Minister and on the same day the present ECNCST was constituted with 31 Members. Professor Naiyyum Choudhury is a member of the ECNCST.

The meeting discussed the implementation of the decisions of the last ECNCST meeting held on 18 June 2005 including formulation of National Science and Technology Policy, formation of National Science and Technology Foundation, actions taken based on National ICT Policy etc. Professor Choudhury reported the present status of the National Science and Technology Policy. A Review Committee was formed by the Ministry of Science and ICT with Professor Choudhury as Convener to update and modify the National Science and Technology Policy submitted by a Committee in June 2006. Professor Choudhury highlighted some of the revisions and modifications made on the S&T Policy 2006 and proposed that the revised policy document (revised S&T Policy 2010) along with the S&T Policy 2006 be circulated to all the scientific organizations, ministries, NGOs and scientific and professional societies for comments. A one- day workshop may then be organized to deal with all the comments received for incorporation as well as finalization of the National Science and Technology Policy. The meeting accepted the proposal.

BRACU TA awarded M.Phil Degree from BUET
