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
Architecture Update

Disaster Management Conference in Nepal

Professor Fuad H Mallick, Director and Tahmina Rahman, Research Assistant of Postgraduate Programs in Disaster Management (PPDM) attended "Dealing with Disasters 2009 International Conference Resilience through Local Governance" held during 11- 12 November, 2009 in Kathmandu, Nepal. The conference was attended by senior policy makers, disaster management specialists, academics from university sectors and a wide range of practitioners representing from Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, South Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Australia, UK, Italy, Denmark, Brazil, USA and Zimbabwe. This was organized as part of the

Dealing with Disasters events held in Teesside in 2006, Northumbria in 2007

and Cardiff in 2008.

Professor Mallick presented his paper "Dissecting Disasters: the educational perspective" in the Communication, Dialogue, Networks and Education theme. He expressed disasters not only as events, but also likely events and events that have happened. He analyzed the continuum and the components of disaster and normal time and how each can complement the learning process about disasters in a way that would lead to a better understanding about curriculum formation in disaster education.

Tahmina's paper was "Structural Strengthening of Settlements in the Coastal Areas of Bangladesh" in the Community Based Disaster Risk Reduction theme. She suggested that physical strengthening of coastal settlements through building/repairing of dwelling houses with local good practice, formal engineered technique, and available sustainable materials, community planning, and improvement of infrastructures can reduce damage of assets and physical environment and thus help in the climate change adaptations.

Faculty visits USA to develop Exchange Program

Professor Zainab Faruqui Ali travelled to the United States during 8-18 November 09 primarily to develop an exchange student program between the University of Illinois at Chicago [UIC] and BRACU. Prof. Ali also delivered lectures at UIC and the Catholic University at Washington DC. Her lecture topic included "Looking at the Works of the Western Master Architects in the East".

At UIC, Prof. Ali met with the student and faculty nominees tentatively selected to participate in the exchange program. She also had several meetings with the Dean, Director and members of the faculty and administrative staff at the School of Architecture. The MoU of this program has been signed by the authorities of both the universities. The first event of the exchange is scheduled for Summer 09 semester when the UIC students accompanied by a UIC faculty will visit Bangladesh to participate in a joint design project with the Architecture students at BRACU. Later they will visit different parts of Bangladesh and India to see examples of old and new architecture.

Khondaker Hasibul Kabir, senior lecturer, has been awarded the Berger Young Architects' Award on 5th November, 2009 for the project, Pubail Retreat as commendation award in the Non Residential category. BRAC Business School Student being recognized as BoP Enthousiast at TU Delft, The Netherlands

Iftekhar Ul Karim, student at BRAC Business School was recognized as Bottom of the Pyramid (BoP) Enthousiast (Dutch term for enthusiastic pursuit) and successfully participated in the International Conference on Impact of Base of the Pyramid Ventures at Delft University of Technology, the Netherlands from 16-18 November, 2009. The conference provided a platform to share conceptual and empirical evidences that address ways to better understand and increase the sustainability impacts of BoP ventures in developing countries. Iftekhar received a full travel scholarship from Royal Philips, the

sponsor of this BoP meet and negotiated at the Value Creation and Sustainable Consumption workshops devising the Bottom-up approach and start-up phase tools for BoP ventures.

BDI Update

BDI receives financial award from Columbia University

BDI has received a financial award from the Earth Institute at Columbia University to upgrade and revamp the Masters in Development Studies program. BDI has been planning a flagship Masters program -- a day program attracting both students and practitioners in a course that combines the best of theoretical classroom teaching with the rich practical field experience that exists. The grant and the network of universities affiliated with Columbia University will assist BDI greatly in designing and offering this new program. BDI will hold discussions with different institutes and departments at BRAC University to build a



truly effective interdisciplinary graduate development studies program.

BDI Hosts CGAP-FORD Second Annual Global Graduation Meeting

BDI hosted the CGAP-FORD Second Annual Global Graduation Meeting from November 16th-20th. Inspired by BRAC's Targeting the Ultra Poor Program (TUP), BRAC Development Institute has partnered with CGAP of World Bank to combine and sequence various safety net programs along with microfinance services to create a pathway for the poorest out of extreme poverty. So far, nine pilots have been implemented in seven countries.

The meeting comprised of two parts- November 16th to 17th was a two-day workshop organized at the BRAC Center in Rajendrapur to discuss about the pilots, share lessons learned, ask questions and discuss success stories with others. The second part of the meeting took place at Hotel Sarina from the 19th to 20th where stakeholders such as donors and programme evaluators were invited to join the discussion along with participants from all the pilots.



Pathways of Women's Empowerment Feminist Organizing Workshop in Bellagio, Italy

Maheen Sultan, Coordinator of the Pathways of Women's Empowerment Programme, and Sohela Nazneen, Research Fellow, convened a workshop in preparation of their proposed book "Voicing Demands: Feminist Reflecting on Strategies, Negotiations and Influence" at the Rockefeller Center in Bellagio, Italy from 2-5 November. The workshop was organized by the Pathways of Women's Empowerment Research Programme and brought together activists and scholars from 11 countries to share drafts of their chapters for feedback and review. The book will contain stories from feminist activists and academics that reflect on the experiences of feminist

activism in exercising voice to realize their rights and negotiate their citizenship with the state and is due out in late 2010.

Discussant at Realizing Rights Research Findings Seminar

Firdous Azim, Lead Research of the Pathways of Women's Empowerment Research Programme, participated at the research findings seminar on 'Understanding Sexuality and Rights in Dhaka City' as a Discussant. The seminar was organized by the James P. Grant School of Public Health and Realizing Rights Research Consortium and took place on 9 November.

Pathways Research Consortium's Communications Team Meeting

The Communications Officers of the five hubs of the Pathways of Women's Empowerment Programme (Latin America, Middle-East, West Africa and UK and South Asia) met in Dhaka in mid-November to review the communication tasks, develop tool-kits and plan on cross-hub projects. They also helped facilitate the two Digital Story-Telling workshops that were held in November.

Digital Story-Telling Workshops

The Pathways of Women's Empowerment Research Programme organized two Digital Story-Telling workshops in November. Digital Stories are 2-3 minute multimedia stories that participants create about their own lives through script-writing, recording, scanning documents, and movie editing. The first workshop, held during 12-14 November, consisted of researchers from the BRAC Development Institute. The second workshop, held during 19-21 November, brought together university students, women attending religious classes and female Vice-Chairmans from Upazila Parishads of three districts. A Closing Ceremony was held on 21 November where five of the Digital Stories created were screened and certificates for the training were distributed by Syed Hashemi, Director, BDI.

Sexual Health Research Methodologies Workshop participation

Aanmona Priyadarshini and Iqbal Ehsan from BDI attended a two-day training on research methodologies for studying sexual health for researchers and others working with vulnerable populations on 22 and 23 November. The training was organised by Realizing Rights Research Programme Consortium of the James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC University and drew on their recently completed work on sex workers and vulnerable minorities in Pakistan.


Amin and Sunida attend a training in Bangkok

IGS Update

A four-days training on Governance, Democracy and Civil Service Leadership Programme was organized jointly by Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre (BPATC), Institute of Governance Studies (IGS) - BRAC University, and Institute on Governance (IOG), Ottawa at the International Training Centre of BPATC from November 9 to 12, 2009. Eighteen civil servants of the rank of Deputy Secretary from different Ministries attended the program. The key objective of the program was to develop an understanding of governance and democracy among civil service leaders, and strengthen their knowledge and skills required in a democracy. International and local experts conducted the sessions. A video-conference session on Ethics and Values was also arranged at BRAC University campus.

Mr. Manzoor Hasan, Director of the Institute attended the Third Conference of the State Parties in Doha, Qatar from 9-13 November 2009 organized by the United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime (UNODC) as part of the Bangladesh delegation. The delegation was lead by the Law Minister Barrister Shafique Ahmed. The Conference was attended by 106 State Parties and 14 governments were there as observers. The objective of the conference was to improve the capacity of and cooperation between State Parties and to promote and review the implementation of the United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC).

The Institute participated in the 'Third Forum of the Parliamentarians' in Doha, Qatar on 10 November 2009 organized by the Global Organization of Parliamentarians Against Corruption (GOPAC). Mr. Saiful Bhuiyan of IGS presented the Action Plan (developed as a follow-up activity to address the findings and recommendations of the Bangladesh Compliance and Gap Analysis with UNCAC) in the forum. The aim of the Forum was to suggest parliamentarians to work with others to be truly effective in supporting the UNCAC and its effective implementation and review. A delegation consisting of three Members of Bangladesh Parliament also participated in the forum and the Conference of the State Parties.

Journalism Training and Research Initiative (JATRI) of IGS conducted a three-day training course on "Interviewing and Source Development Techniques" from 2-4 November 2009 for the Dhaka University Correspondents of electronic and print media, who are also active members of Dhaka University Journalist Association (DUJA). This training focused on the different aspect of Interviewing and Source Development Techniques of Journalism. Mr. Ralph Frammolino, Award winning US Journalist (formerly with the Loss Angeles Times) was the Lead Trainer of the course.

JATRI Training Team organized a consultation meeting to exchange the experiences and challenges of photo journalism and accordingly to assess training needs for photo journalists on 15 November 2009 at JATRI board meeting room. Twenty photo journalists from different newspapers and news agencies participated in the meeting, where it was decided that JATRI Training Team would organize a three-day long training for the photo journalists on the ethics and standards of photo journalism and will also cover behavior and technical skill. This training is scheduled to be held next year.

The Affiliated Network on Social Accountability - South Asia (ANSA-SA), housed at the Institute, organized a three day residential proposal development workshop for the potential grantees at the Pegasus Reef Hotel in Colombo Sri Lanka from 23 to 25 November 2009. This regional workshop was attended by participants from India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. The purpose of this workshop was to train the participants in writing a proposal and also developing a common understanding of the context. The workshop was facilitated by Dr. Suresh Raghavan.

MNS Update

International Conference on Gender Participation in the Development of Sciences 14 - 15 November 2009, Dhaka, Bangladesh



Professor Naiyyum Choudhury, Dr. Aparna Islam and Ms Adeeba Raihan participated in the International Conference on Gender Participation in the Development of Science, held at the NMST Auditorium, Agargaon, Dhaka 1207, and organized by Bangladesh Academy of Sciences (BAS), the Inter Academy Panel on International Issues (IAP), the Network of Academies of Sciences in Islamic Countries (NASIC) and the Academy of Sciences for the Developing World (TWAS). The theme of the Conference was Women Scientists for

Development. In addition to the Fellows of the Bangladesh Academy of Sciences and about 10 scientists from Asia and Africa including Malaysia, India, Pakistan and Uganda nearly 300 women scientists from different academic and research organizations, both in the public and private sectors participated. They discussed the status of women in science education at the primary, secondary and higher levels in different countries and regions and ways and means of improving the methods of science education, status of women scientists in different countries, their problems in career building in professional lives and finding out the means for improving the present situation.

Architect, Yeafesh Osman, Hon'ble State Minister, Ministry of Science and Information & Communication Technology, GOB was the Chief Guest at the Inaugural Ceremony, presided over by Professor M. Shamsher Ali, President of the Bangladesh Academy of Sciences and moderated by Professor Naiyyum Choudhury. In his inaugural speech the State Minister said that the government is committed to ensure women's participation in all the programmes and activities of the government including promotion of science and technology. He also mentioned in his speech that without participation of women the vision 2021 could not be materialized. Professor Choudhury delivered the welcoming address.

Academic Programs MPH program



Courses

The MPH course Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases (MPH 620) took place through November 1-19, 2009. Dr. Richard Cash and Dr. Steve Luby coordinated the module. Dr. Mizanur Rahman also taught while other renowned lecturers from ICDDR,B and IEDCR took few classes. Dr. Sadia Afreen from ICDDR,B's; Dr. Taufique Joarder and Asif Kashem from JPGSPH acted as the Teaching Assistants for the module. At the end of the module students delivered presentations along

with a report based on their field experiences.

A 3-day "Methodology Workshop" for MPH students was held on November 21-.25, 2009 to review research methodology, scientific writing, and practical issues in the field. Centre for health systems studies

Revitalizing Health for All: Developing a comprehensive Primary Health Care model for Bangladesh (CPHC project): Data analysis of both quantitative and qualitative part of the project has been started.

CENTRE FOR GENDER, SEXUALITY AND HIV/AIDS

Gender Based Violence Research: The Centre's research on Gender Based Violence in Urban Slums is progressing at a rapid pace. We have completed our screening data collection and are preparing to start indepth interviews by mid December. The collaborative GBV study in Dhaka and Nairobi is part of the DFID funded Realizing Rights research consortium.

Realising Rights Annual Meeting

A total of 12 participants from APHRC, Kenya, INDEPTH-Network, Ghana, LSHTM and IDS, UK, and JPGSPH, BRAC University, Bangladesh attended the meeting. The objective of the meeting was to discuss among the partners ongoing progress with dissemination activities and outputs for the final year, sharing experience and achievements of the RPC from the



perspective of the "story", the cross-RPC final dissemination event, next year's budget and future research partnerships and links after the RPC.

Realizing Rights Communication Strategies for 2010 Meeting

Members of the Realizing Rights research consortium met on November 26, 2009 to discuss communication strategies for the upcoming year. The RPC will conclude with national and international dissemination events, including an International Men's Health Conference in Dhaka in June 2010. Participants discussed ways to engage with

different audiences including journalists, policy makers, NGO's, donors, law enforcement and the general population, and brainstormed on effective communication strategies to disseminate the findings from the ongoing research projects funded by RPC and DFID.

One Day, One Struggle Campaign

On November 9, 2009, over 20 organizations held simultaneous events and public demonstrations as part of the historic international campaign "One Day One Struggle" organized by the Coalition for Sexual and

Bodily Rights in Muslim Societies (CSBR). A very diverse group of NGOS staged bold actions in 11 countries (across North Africa Middle East, South and Southeast Asia participating in this endeavour) to assert that sexual and reproductive rights are universal human rights based on the inherent freedom, dignity and equality of all human beings. The Centre of Gender, Sexuality and HIV/AIDS (CGSH) in support of the international struggle for universal human rights organized a seminar facilitated by Dr. Dina Siddiqui to disseminate her research project on contemporary sexual patterns of urbanites in Dhaka.

GFATM project - 913

Workshop on Sexual and Reproductive Health of Men in Rangpur

The participants of the workshops were community people, specialists on venereal diseases, NGO health workers, Representatives took part ranging from different local and national newspapers to informal providers like village doctors, Kabiraj/Hakim, homeopath etc. Owasim Akram, Research Associate at the School, shared research findings on Men's Sexual and Reproductive Health during the workshops. Dr. Shah Mohammad Riazul Islam, Civil Surgeon, Rangpur attended the workshops as the Chief Guest. Md. Rafiqul Islam, UHFPO, Gangachara Upazilla Health Complex; Dr. Salima Rahman, Director-Community Health, staffs of BRAC Health Program were present at the workshops. The workshops got coverage in different local and national newspapers along with a news clip in the Banglavision channel (One of the leading private television channel in Bangladesh.).



Multi-Disciplinary Workshop on Research Methodologies for Studying Sexual Health

The Research Programme Consortium on Improving Sexual and Reproductive Health for Poor and Vulnerable Populations "Realising Rights" held a two day multi-disciplinary workshop on 'Research methodologies for studying sexual health' for researchers and others working with vulnerable populations. The workshop was organised by the James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC University on November 22-23, 2009 at BRAC Centre. James P Grant It was facilitated by Dr Martine Collumbien and Dr Sarah Hawkes, experienced researchers in this field from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical
