Institute of Governance Studies

The Institute has been involved with a number of projects and activities. Dr Shahnaz Karim, Assistant Director, met Development Alternative surrounding possible collaborative work surrounding their recently successful bid with USAID Bangladesh. Dr Karim also met a delegation from the Government of Norway as part of their fact-finding mission on the governance situation in Bangladesh.

The Institute held a workshop on the Compliance Review of the United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC) with the Ministry of Law, Justice & Parliamentary Affairs. Senior government officials, along with stakeholders from civil society as well as the media, attended the workshop. Ms Gretta Fenner, Director of the Basel Institute on Governance was also invited to provide expert advice during the workshop.

The Institute also hosted its second seminar of the Seminar Series. Dr Paul Posner, Program Director, George Mason University (GMU) presented his paper on 'Third Party Governance: Transformations in Public Management' at the Conference Room of the Institute. All IGS faculty & staff, faculty attended this from BRAC University as well as others from surrounding Universities. The University also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with GMU; the VC signed on behalf of the University.

The students from the Masters in Governance & Development program began their month long international study tour to South Korea and China. The Korean Development Institute (KDI) hosted the students for fifteen days which included workshops and seminars aimed at enhancing and providing a rounded understanding of the processes of governance from an international perspective. After completing their trip to Korea, the students travelled to Sichuan Province, China, where they were hosted by Sichuan University. The students returned to Bangladesh on 1st December.

Mr Manzoor Hasan, Director, was part of a Government of Bangladesh delegation from the Local Government Division to Jakarta to attend the Regional Forum on Reinventing Government in Asia. Mr Hasan also attended a two-day brainstorming Workshop on Social Accountability (SAC) in Delhi with the view of making the Institute a regional centre for training on social accountability. In the final leg of his journey, Mr Hasan joined the Masters students in their trip to Korea where he met the Dean of the Korean Development Institute (KDI) where further discussions were held to strengthen ties between KDI and the Institute under the existing MoU between the two parties.

BRAC School of Public Health

Courses on Healthcare Financing

World Health Organization is supported two consecutive short courses on Health Care Financing in Bangladesh for Upazila-level health and family planning officials. Each course was for two weeks, the first one started November 4th. The courses dealt with the dynamics of decision-making in allocation of financial resources for health. In short, it discussed the fundamental principles of health economics as well as that of healthcare financing in the context of Bangladesh. Professor Anwar Islam coordinated the course.

Course on Health Equity

The School in collaboration with World Bank and the World Bank Institute, Washington DC and the ICCDR, B offered the second course on Equity in Health tailored for participants from Bangladesh. It was a five-day course for the health sector managers, government officials and public health experts involved in health sector reform from November 11th - 15th, 2007 at BRAC Center.

Poverty and social inequality impact on the performance of health systems, and conversely, the design of the health system has the potential to improve the welfare of the poor and reduce social inequalities. This course aimed to share knowledge and policy experience on how health systems can mitigate the effects of poverty and improve equity in the financing and delivery of health care services.

The course was facilitated by Dr. Davidson Gwatkin of the World Bank, Dr Richard Cash of Harvard University, Dr. Abbas Bhuiya of ICCDR,B and Dr. Mushtaque Chowdhury of BRAC University. This course was the second after successful completion of the first course held in June 2007. This course had 38 participants involving midlevel government officials, health experts working in different NGOs, private universities, donor agencies and private sector. Mathematics and Natural Sciences (MNS) Department

Seminar Organized by the MNS Department

Ms. Moushumi Zahur, Lecturer of Geography at the Department of Mathematics & Natural Sciences gave a seminar entitled "Solid Waste Management of Dhaka- Community Compost Projects" on Thursday, November 8, 2007, at 11.00 am in Room ST 603. Faculty members of MNS and other departments and some students attended the seminar.

Lecture at the 15th Astronomy Workshop

Professor Mofiz Uddin Ahmed delivered a lecture at the 15th Astronomy Workshop, which was jointly organized by the Bangladesh Astronomical Association and the Russian Science and Culture Centre at its office at House # 510, Road # 7, Dhanmondhi R/A, Dhaka-1209 on Saturday November 3, 2007. The topic of the lecture was "The Universe and its Process of Evolution".

The origin of the universe, its contents and evolution, and its ultimate fate were outlined in the lecture. The cosmological notion of space and time, elements of special and general theory of relativity of Einstein were explained to the audience most of whom were students of different schools and colleges. Contribution of Professor Subramaniam Chandrasekar in cosmology and that of Professor Meghnad Saha in astrophysics were highlighted. After the lecture a question-answer session was held, which was actively participated by the participants in the workshop. The participants evinced keen interest in the subject and were very eager to learn about the field of astrophysics and cosmology. Professor Ahmed also informed the participants about the BS Programme in Physicsoffered at BRAC University.

Participation in Conference

Mr. Anisur Rahaman, Lecturer of Physics at the Department of Mathematics & Natural Sciences attended The 16th Asian Conference of Radiological Technologists (ACRT) & 9th National Conference of Indian Association of Radiological Technologists (NCIART), held at the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh, India from 15-18 November,2007.He presented a paper entitled "Manual and treatment planning system based dosimetry in remote afterloading brachytherapy" which evoked a lot of interest amongst the participants.

Visit to SPARRSO and BMD

BRAC University Club of Natural Sciences (BUNSC) organized a study tour to the Bangladesh Space Research and Remote Sensing Organization (SPARRSO) and the Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD). The tour was scheduled on November 14, 2007 and a team of about twenty-five including students and faculty members set off to Agargaon SPARRSO was established in 1980 as an autonomous organization and it is now operating under the Ministry of Defence. Although space technology application work is being carried out in the country from 1968, SPARRSO was created formally in1980 as a multisectoral R and D organization for peaceful applications of space science and technology. At SPARRSO, a presentation was made regarding its ongoing activities in various sectors. Students were told about the advanced technology that is being used to monitor disasters and the environment. The visitors were also told about the wide range of applications of remote sensing and the accuracy with which it operates. The list of on-going activities at SPARRSO was very impressive. The commonly held notion that remote sensing could only be used for weather forecasting was corrected, as the range of application of this technology is really very wide. In Bangladesh, remote sensing applications are made in the sectors of agriculture, fisheries, water resources, forestry, land use etc. It is also used for disaster monitoring by estimating the damage due to natural calamities such as cyclones, tornados, floods, droughts etc. It played a vital role in estimating damages caused by major floods and cyclones throughout the history of Bangladesh. Remote sensing technique coupled with GIS is used in preparing maps and monitoring water bodies of Bangladesh to be used in any detailed study, including the drainage pipe plan. After the elucidation of such amazing facts, a lively discussion followed. Queries were answered in detail. The team was later taken on a brief tour of the organization and went round the laboratories observing the ground station in operation. The second part of the visit was made to the Bangladesh Meteorological Department, which is spread over a large span of land with its landmark- the globe- on top of the building. Once the team was there a short presentation was made about the Department and how it operates. Bangladesh Meteorological Department is a government institution, under the Ministry of Defence and runs metrological activities in the country. The long process of

collecting data, recording it, analyzing it and then finally passing it on to respective sectors was explained. The visiting students and faculty were shown the different observatory equipment used for weather monitoring and forecasting. The Department maintains many state-of-the-art observatories for both surface and upper level round the clock observation of numerous features of the environment. There were about 35 interesting equipment including devices that measure the temperature at different distances under the ground, equipment that takes humidity readings and so on. The data from these observatories are collected in coded form and printed using a tele-printer and can only be decoded by trained personnel. There is an ongoing exchange of data between neighboring countries for proper forecasting. Then the visiting team went to the forecasting room, which was humming with activity with the then impending cyclone Sidr. It was fascinating to see the image of the cyclone that was approaching Bangladesh from the south. The power of the cyclone could be sensed within that room with people rushing to and from with data. It was very impressive to see how data was collected and instantly sent to relevant centers for further study. To forecast the weather of Bangladesh a wide range of data had to be collected from a region extending from Middle East to Japan. The data is manually mapped onto the atlases of the respective countries. These maps are created round the clock to properly estimate or forecast the weather of Bangladesh and are stored in the Department's archive for any further study. The students came back with a deep sense of pride in the fact that such highly technical R& D organizations are functioning in our country and rendering great service to the people.

BRAC University Institute of Educational Development (BU-IED)

Dr. Manzoor Ahmed at Istanbul Conference on Education and Empowerment of WomenDirector of BU-IED, Dr. Manzoor Ahmed, was invited to share Bangladesh and BRAC experience and challenges in respect of gender discrimination and promoting women's empowerment through education.

About 120 participants including concerned government agencies, particularly, the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education (MOPME), Directorate of Primary Education (DPE), civil society groups, researchers, development partners, persons of different print and electronic media, academicians, and national and international NGO personnel attended the consultation.

Apart from a presentation of progress in PEDP II by Chowdhury Muffad Ahmed, Joint Programme Director, Mr. Musharraf Hussain Bhuiya, Secretary of the Minsitry of Primary and Mass Education, and Mr. K. M. Asaduzzaman, the Director General of Primary Education, responded to comments from the audience. On behalf of the donors, Ms Hua Du, Country Director of the Asian Development Bank, Steffan Lock, Chair of the PEDPII Donors Consortium and Brajesh Panth, ADB Programme Manager for PEDP II, spoke.

Workshop on Non-Formal Education
