BU Team Visits Philippines & Singapore

Prof Abdur Rab, Chairperson, Department of Management & Business Administration, BU and Ms. Husna Mehnaz Siddiqi, Lecturer, Department of Computer Science and Engineering, BU made official visits to various reputed institutions of Singapore and Philippines from September 23 to September 27, 2002. They visited INSEAD (Singapore), the National University of Singapore (NUS), University of Philippines (Dilimar). Prof. Rab, additionally visited University of Philippines, Manila and the Asian Institute of Management (AIM). During the visits fruitful discussions were carried out with the Vice Dean, Computer Science Department, NUS, Head of the Department of Engineering, International Relations Officers, NUS, Head of the Department of Computer Science, UP, Dilimar, Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, UP, Manila, Dean, College of Business Administration, UP, Manila. Professor Osmani Joins BU as a Visiting Professor

He obtained Ph.D. in economics from the London School of Economics and then worked at the Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies, Dhaka and at the World Institute for Development Economics Research, Helsinki before joining the University of Ulster. He has published widely on issues related to poverty, inequality, hunger, famine, nutrition, and development problems in general and his books include Economic Inequality and Group Welfare and Nutrition and Poverty. He is currently serving as Special Adviser to the United Nations High Commissioner on Human Rights on matters related to economic rights. Professor Osmani joined BU on September 1, 2002.

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
