Students and teachers of Architecture take part in a multi- University project on Beltola slum, Dhaka

22 students of the Departments of Architecture, Water Management and Geography from Hogeschool van Amsterdam, HvA [architecture, water management], BRAC University [architecture], Ahsanullah University of Science & Technology, AUST [architecture], Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology, BUET [water management] and University of Dhaka [geography] had embarked on a collaborative research project titled 'architecture, urbanism and water management of low cost housing in the Beltola Slum, Mirpur, Dhaka'. They were guided by Prof. Bert van der Weil and Rutger Hogezand [HvA], Prof Zainab Faruqui Ali and K. Hasibul Kabir [BRACU], Prof. Nazem [CUS, University of Dhaka], Shuja Khan, Shezad Zahir, Imran [AUST].

This is one of those rare projects where various university students join to work on a collaborative research project. In small multidisciplinary teams, they surveyed the slum on various aspects for a week. The second week was spent on workshops at AUST and BRACU leading to design suggestions on improved architecture,









urbanism and water management for the site. At the final presentation of their projects on 26 October 2011 at CB 901, **Professor Ainun Nishat**, the Vice Chancellor, Chairperson, Department of Architecture, teachers of the participating universities, students and representatives of the Beltola slum were present. The teams are now preparing a publication on this special work.

CfL Updates

CfL conducted English in Schools (EiS) workshops



Three workshops have been conducted for the English in Schools (EiS) project by the faculty members of BRAC University Centre for Languages (BRACU-CfL) at Comilla, Madhupur and Srimangol BRAC Learning Centre (BLC) in October

2011. EiS is a project that manages to prepare and publish English language learning materials in The Daily Star for the secondary school students. CfL has been working with EiS for more than one year and thus it gathered enough experience of preparing newspaper based English learning materials. At the same time CfL wants to take it further. Accordingly, the purposes of the workshop have been decided to know the magnitude of familiarity of EiS pages among the stakeholders, measures to be taken for adequately effective material designing and expected steps to be initiated to reach these pages to the grassroot level. The workshops included English teachers and students of the secondary schools, BRAC 'Chhatra Bandhu', 'Gono Kendo' librarians, PACE managers and programme organizers. During the workshop, participants spontaneously worked to bring out the ways to enhance usage of EiS pages, in particular, how the pages can be brought in classrooms teaching to supplement the existing English of school level textbooks.

Sunjida Afrin Khan presented paper at Sydney University



Sunjida Afrin Khan, faculty member of Centre for Languages (CfL), presented a paper titled "Linguistic Chauvinism Constraining Linauistic Riaht of Indigenous Children in Nation States: Cases of Bangladesh and Australia" in the 5th International Free Linguistics Conference at The University of Sydney. The conference was organized by the Department of Linguistics, Faculty of Arts, School of Media, Letters, and Sydney

University Linguistics Society from October 8-9, 2011. In her paper she argues how exclusionary education policy can lead to the inevitable corollary of violation of elementary rights. In particular, linauistic constrain can be one of the reasons for the major drop out of indigenous children from the primary level of education whose mother tongue is not Bangla. She has also addressed the linguistic situation of Australia where the policy has failed to ensure linguistic right for

service without change! After my test

the children in the Northern Territory who are monolingual in a language other than English, which can cause death of the rest of the endangered Indigenous languages in Australia.

Counseling Unit Updates

Workshop



On 20th October 2011, Thursday, the Counseling Unit arranged their first workshop of this semester entitled 'Towards a Peaceful & Productive Life: A Unique Opportunity'. The main motto of this workshop was to develop the awareness about this service and to break the stigmas and demystify the process of counseling. The target participants of the workshop were

the students. The session started with a **Mousumi Bhowmi**k song 'Ami Sunechhi Sedin Tumi' and later the participants were asked to explain the lyrics and to find out its relevance with Counseling. Then the key facilitator of the workshop Farida Akhtar, the consultant of Counseling Unit, shared few cases where students close to the participants' age of other universities were helped from counseling. Then few PowerPoint slides were presented by three counselors Shami Suhrid, Sumaiya Anwar and Farjana Abedin which covered what is counseling, steps it follows in the process, what is not counseling, effects of counseling, difference between psychiatrist and psychologist etc. After that, different psychological needs were discussed by reading out a poster. At the end, a mini 'imaginery relaxation' was done with the song 'Kothao Amar Harie Jawar Nei Mana' playing in the background. Finally, all the participants were given an evaluation sheet to fill up where they wrote their impression over the workshop and proposed topics for future seminars or workshops. There were about 100 students participated in the 1and half hour workshop that could make students more enthusiastic about the counseling service at BRAC University.

As part of spreading the news of the service of counseling unit and the workshop, the unit visited the department of Architecture on the third week this month where we went into as many as four classes and talked to the students for few minutes. We also visited the class of the course of Psychology in the department of ESS to invite them in the workshop and let them know about the unit and its services. This journey started with visiting the

Centre for Languages on 23rd of June, 2011. The faculties and counselors were involved in a fruitful discussion on how to make the students more aware of the service, how to refer students and so on. From the discussion, the forum came up with a decision that the counselors will be given the opportunity to visit the classes to build a better rapport with the students and find out the ones who can be benefited by the counseling service. The next meeting was held at JPG School of Public Health on 29th of June, 2011. This time the Counseling Unit delivered a brief presentation on 'What is counseling', highlighting the misconceptions of counseling and the real meaning of it. The presentation also covered the symptoms of stress, anxiety and depression that a student might suffer from and also the issue of confidentiality as a basic principle of counseling. After the presentation the faculties shared their experiences where they thought this service has a lot to offer to. The unit discussed the referral system and the contact information for further engagements.

GFATM 913 PROJECT

3-week Course on HIV/AIDS related Issues, Management, Monitoring and Evaluation



3-week course on HIV/AIDS related issues. management, monitoring and evaluation was organized by GFATM-Rollina Continuation Channel project of James P Grant School of Public health, **BRAC** University funded by The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. The project titled 'Building and Strengthening the Technical and Institutional Capacities of Government, NGOs, and Implementing Partners' is part of the Expanding HIV Prevention program in Bangladesh.

The course took place from 09-27 October, 2011 at the BRAC Learning Center (BLC), Uttara, Dhaka. A total of 18 participants of GFATM and non-GFATM NGOs from 20 project districts and members of the STI/AIDS Network of Bangladesh participated in the course. The main purpose of the course was to contribute to better management and quality implementation of HIV/AIDS prevention program in the field level through developing the capacity of mid level managers.

The course designed for HIV/AIDS related issues for 8 days (48 hours) that covered: basic HIV/AIDS, risk of MARPs, STI management, care and support etc.; Management issues for 2 days (09 hours) that included projects management, team building, effective communication, problem solving, decision making, coordination etc; and Monitoring & Evaluation for 6 days (33 hours) that contains Basics of M&E, indicator setting, data collection methods and analysis, report writing

Experts of specific areas were invited to facilitate specific sessions in the course. Besides, internal resource persons facilitated the sessions. The 3-week course was started with welcoming address by **Dr. S.M Idris Ali**, Program Manager, NASP and **Alhaj Mohammad Fazlul Haque**, Vice Chairman, STI/AIDS Network of Bangladesh and senior level staff of GFATM-913.

A formal concluding session was held at the end of the course. The Line Director, National AIDS/STD Propgramme (NASP), Dr. M. A. Waheed attended the closing session. The participants were awarded with certificates by the Line Director for successful completion of the course.

Orientation on Standard Operating Procedures for Services to People Living with HIV and AIDS

The orientation took place from 22-27 October 2011 at the BRAC Learning Center (BLC), Uttara, Dhaka. A total of 25 participants participated in the SOP Orientation from JAGORI-ICDDRB, BSMMU, Ashar Alo Society, Mukto Akash

Bangladesh and Confidential Approach to AIDS Prevention (CAAP). The main purpose of the orientation was to strengthen the capacity of service providers of delivery organizations and institutions to provide quality services to PLHA through effective implementation of service standards as per the SOP. The course was designed based on the SOP and included topics such as: Prevention, Treatment and Nursing Care, Psychosocial Support, Legal and Human Rights Support, Socioeconomic Support, National M&E system, etc.

A concluding session was held at the end of the course. The participants were awarded with certificates for successful completion of the course.

PAY FOR PERFORMANCE

Since May 2011, the James P Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH) has been working with the Population Council on the Pay for Performance (P4P) research project. In October, 2011, the activities of P4P included a Quality Assurance Group (OAG) visit at Jamalpur district to check the quality of public MNCH services in intervention areas. This visit consisted of representatives from secondary and tertiary public health facilities along with representatives from Population Council and JPGSPH. Three consecutive visits had been accomplished on January, April and July of 2011 in this regard. The latest visit was coordinated by one of the Researchers of JPGSPH to four public health facilities (Jamalpur District Hospital, Islampur Upazila Health Complex, Bakhsiganj Upazila Health Complex and Melandha Upazila Health Complex) of Jamalpur district from October 9-12, 2011. Upon completion of the performance assessment, the facilities were remarked against a quantitative checklist and expert opinion. The next quarter's target has been set over a meeting amongst the QAG members. A Quarterly Progress Report on the outcome and a Financial Report has already been submitted to the Population Council's head office in New York.
