Vice Chancellor participated in the Climate Change Conference in Bonn, Germany

Professor Ainun Nishat Attended the UNFCCC's Climate Change Conference in Bonn, Germany as a core member of the Bangladesh Government's Negotiation Team. It was the 36th sessions of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) and of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA), the fifteenth session of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Long-term Cooperative Action under the Convention (AWG-LCA), the seventeenth session of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Further Commitments for Annex I Parties under the Kyoto Protocol (AWG-KP) and the first session of the Ad Hoc Working Group on the Durban Platform for Enhanced Action (ADP) that took place concurrently from 14 to 25 May, 2012. Apart from this, **Professor Nishat** also attended a side event on work programme for loss and damage assessment held in the United Nations University, Bonn. His presentation included the range of approaches for addressing the risk of loss and damage due to climate change, which is also an ongoing research carried out by the C3ER, BRAC University.

The fourth installment of the Master Class, organized by the BRAC Business School was held on the 31st of May, 2012 at BRAC University Mohakhali Campus. It was sponsored by Dhaka Bank Limited. The guest speaker for the event was **Mr. Sabbir Ahmed**, FCA, who worked at KPMG Australia before becoming a partner at **Hoda Vasi Chowdhury** & Company, the member firm of Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu in Bangladesh. **Mr. Sabbir** spoke enthusiastically about the



many uses and benefits of the balance sheet in the world of accounting.

He started from the ground up, explaining to the students present at the Master Class, the core

components of the balance sheet and how each of the elements differ for different entities. **Mr. Ahmed** further discussed the several purposes of the balance sheet and how different stakeholders use this accounting statement to evaluate a firm. Special attention was given when discussing the Ratios used in Balance Sheet appraisals, as these helps to evaluate the strength, liquidity and efficiency of a business.

Mr. Sabbir Ahmed mentioned that it is possible to know a lot about a business by only looking at the Balance Sheet alone. However, he ended his class by shedding light on the limitations of the Balance Sheet, explaining that this form of a financial statement is based a lot on estimates, and might not show the absolute picture in complete detail. He also mentioned how the non financial aspects of a business are never shown in the Balance Sheet and the one's that are shown, such as goodwill, are only estimated values.

The speaker for the event interacted with the large number of students present at the event, answering all of their questions to the best of his abilities, using real life situations to help everyone understand the concepts better. The BRAC Business School organized the Master Class and **Ms. Afsana Akhtar**, Asst. Prof, BBS and **Mr. Saif Hossain**, lecturer, BBS, supervised the entire event. A large number of students showed up to participate in the event, which depicts the enthusiasm for accounting in the students of BRAC University.

C3ER Updates

Visit from the University of Dundee, UK

Centre for Climate Change and Environmental Research (C3ER) attended a meeting on April 26, 2012 at the University Grant Commission (UGC) to welcome Professor John Rowan who is the Director of the Centre for Environmental Change and Human Resilience (CECHR), Reader in Geography, School of the Environment University of Dundee, UK. Professor Rowan was also accompanied by Professor Colin Palmer, Professor of Pharmacogenomics, in the Biomedical Research Institute in the University of Dundee. The meeting was to discuss about research that is being done at CECHR, particularly on the topic of climate change impacts on health. Possible collaboration between institutions and Rowan's research were explored, and the complexity of health and climate change were addressed. Possible areas for further research involved the relationship of arsenic exposure on diseases which are assumed to be genetic. Professor Fuad Hasan Mallick, Chairperson of School of Architecture and Mr Ishfaq Ilahi Choudhury, Registrar of the BRAC University gave a brief introduction about academic and research activities of the University. Professor **Mallick** also briefed about ongoing research activities carried out by C3ER. After the meeting at the UGC, Professor Rowan visited BRAC University and promised seamless cooperation from CECHR on potential partnership in different areas of research on climate change and academic excellence.

IED Updates

Needs Assessment of Adolescent Girls and Boys in Bangladesh

A meeting was held with Dr. Sajeda Amin (Population Council) during which a concept paper was shared on the proposed adolescent study. In order to hear from the adolescent population themselves, researchers on separate occasions sat with 6 madrasah students (3 female; 3 male); 9 adolescents studying filmmaking and journalism (3 female; 6 male); 10 urban adolescents enrolled in secondary schools at Grades 9 and 10 (5 female; 5 male); and rural adolescents who are SCOPE centre graduates in Gongachara (including 6 girls aged 14-16 years). The purpose of the discussions was to investigate the perspectives and needs of the adolescents. A discussion involving 15 mothers of adolescent children was also held to gather information on the perspective of parents. To further aid with the design and development of the study, Dr. Kazi Golam Rasul (Marie Stopes) was consulted on the sexual reproductive health problems of adolescents and the services currently available to them, and **Dr. Nishat Fatima Rahman** was consulted on the prevalence of substance abuse in Bangladesh. Based on the findings of the above discussions with adolescents and professionals, a concept paper was further modified on a study which proposes to develop adolescent journalists to track and gather information on the needs of rural SCOPE centre graduates.

Skills Development in Bangladesh: Status and Prospects

Following research instrument development and piloting of instruments in the previous month, in May the research instruments were finalised and presented to the Campaign for Popular Education (CAMPE) for their feedback and approval. Thereafter, Field Research Assistants were recruited and trained in 2 batches on their roles in conducting the research. Field Research Assistants subsequently began collecting data through a nationwide household survey of 23,610 young people (aged 10-24 years). The survey aims to help build a skills profile of the participants and explore their demands and expectations.

An Evaluation of IED-BRACU's Action Research Programmes on Registered Non-Government Primary Schools

A pilot test of the research instruments to be used in the evaluation study was conducted in Kaliganj, Lalmonirhat. Following this, the research instruments were finalised and a 3-day orientation was held for Field and Community Researchers on data collection techniques. The process of data collection began at the end of May.



Short Courses for the GoB Officials

As a continuation of providing the short courses to the government officials, one batch of six-day short course on How Head Teachers and AUEOs Can Make Schools Work' has completed on 12 May to 17 May 2012. This is the ninth batch of the training programme which is a joint collaboration of Directorate of Primary Education (DPE) and Institute of Educational Development, BRAC University (IED-BRACU). Twenty Five participants (Head Teachers and Assistant Upazilla Education Officers) have participated in the training. Deputy Director (Rajshahi division) of DPE attended the inauguration session.

IED, BRAC U's involvement in government's curriculum and textbook development initiatives

The Government has undertaken new initiatives to design curriculums and textbooks in light of the Education Policy 2010. National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB) is carrying out this great responsibility with the help of its own professionals as well as the professionals and practitioners of other government and non-government organisations in the country.

IED, BRAC U has been directly involved in this curriculum development and textbook writing activity. Two IED specialists have been involved from the beginning-one in developing English primary and secondary curriculums and textbooks and the other in making illustrations, layout and graphic designs for English primary textbooks. They are still continuing their work. Two other professionals from IED, BRAC U had also been involved in this activity-one evaluated the draft curriculum and the manuscript of a primary Bangla textbook and the other evaluated the manuscript of a primary Maths textbook.

IGS Updates

The reporters and editors of Maasranga television were provided with RTI Guide book and posters which were developed by ANSA-SAR. The event was jointly moderated by **Ralph Frammolino**, a former Los Angeles Times reporter and currently a media development consultant and **Golam Kibria**, a former Daily Prothom Alo reporter and journalism trainer.

Meeting with Dr. Abed Chaudhury

Dr Islam is a public health specialist from Bangladesh and now the Director of the Health System and Development since March 2012 and before that the Director of Family Health and Research Department in WHO Regional Office for South-East Asia. He received his medical degree (MBBS) from Dhaka University in 1979 and received MPH from Amsterdam University. He was awarded FRCOG by the Royal College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, UK (2007). **Dr Islam** visited and provided policy and strategic support to 75 countries in Asia, Africa, Middle East, Eastern Europe, Pacific and in Latin America. He has number of scientific articles published in peered reviewed journals including the Lancet and authored chapters in various globally reputed Medical and Public Health Text books. He has extensive working experience with Multi-Lateral Organizations e.g. UNICEF, UNFPA, FAO, ILO, UNHCR, World Bank, Asia and African Development Bank, various donors, Institutions, NGOs and professional bodies and well known personality globally in public health.

Health Governance Research at the Public Health Foundation of India

The Dean of the JPGSPH invited everyone at SPH to a seminar entitled Health Governance Research at the Public Health Foundation of India. May 30, 2012 at Sasakawa Auditorim, icddr,b. The special guest was **Dr Kabir Sheikh**, Head of the Health Governance Hub - the Public Health Foundation of India. **Dr Kabir Sheikh** is the Head of the Health Governance Hub - the Public Health Foundation of India's interdisciplinary program of health governance research, research capacity-building and advocacy. He has a PhD in public health and policy from the LSHTM, and former training in social medicine (University of Delhi) and infectious disease epidemiology (LSHTM). His career has encompassed research, teaching and training, health systems strengthening and policy development in 15 states of India, Sub Saharan Africa, the Asia Pacific, Bangladesh, Brazil and globally through assignments with WHO HQ, DFID and AUSAID research consortia.

In 2011, he led the technical team (citizen and private sector participation) for the Government of India commissioned report on Universal Health Coverage. **Dr Sheikh** is a Bellagio scholar (2011) and an Aga Khan Foundation international scholar (2003-06). He has published widely in peer-reviewed journals, and is editor (with Asha George) of the volume: 'Health Providers in India: On the Frontlines of Change' (Routledge 2010). His current interests focus on health

stewardship and regulation, health workforce policy, community action in health, and health policy & systems research methodology.

PROJECT UPDATES

GFATM_TB

Course on Public Health Management for Tuberculosis Program Managers - May 2012

JPGSPH offered a course titled 'Public Health Management for Tuberculosis Program Managers', in partnership with BRAC Health Program, BRAC Learning Division and icddr,b from 19 May, 2012 to 31 May, 2012. The course was attended by 23 participants from the following 12 districts: Bhola, Bogra, Chittagong, Comilla, Dhaka, Dinajpur, Faridpur, Kurigram, Kushtia, Mymensingh, Rangamati, Sylhet.

Participants included area managers, consultants, deputy project managers, district managers, health managers, program officers, regional managers, senior district managers, senior medical officers and senior sector specialists and from BRAC and 4 partner organizations including Damien Foundation, Lutheran Aid to Medicine in Bangladesh (LAMB), National Anti-Tuberculosis Association of Bangladesh (NATAB) and Rangpur Dinajpur Rural Service Bangladesh (RDRS).

The course was inaugurated on Saturday, 19 May, 2012 by **Dr. Md. Nuruzzaman Haque**, Deputy Director MBDC & Program Manager-TB, Directorate General of Health Services, **Dr. Kaosar Afsana**, Director, BRAC Health Program, **Dr. Aftab Uddin**, Senior Manager, Technical Training Unit, icddr,b and **Ms. Ismat Bhuiya**, Director Programs, JPGSPH, BRAC University. A highly qualified resource pool of 25 resource persons from governmental, nongovernmental, national and international organizations was developed. The course provided critical insight into health systems strengthening in light of tuberculosis programs, covering topics such as health systems requirements, human resource management, health care financing and governance and leadership skills.

The course ended on Thursday, 31 May, 2012 with a certificate giving ceremony. **Dr. Md. Ashaque Husain**, Director MBDC & Line Director-TB/Leprosy National TBs Control Program (NTP), DGHS, Dr. Md. Akramul Islam, Associate Director, BRAC Health Program, **Dr. Aftab Uddin**, Senior Manager, Technical Training Unit, icddr,b and **Ms. Ismat Bhuiya**, Director Programs, JPGSPH, BRAC University attended the certificate giving ceremony.

UNICEF MNH Review

The UNICEF MNH review team piloted the tools (survey questions for the relevant actors) in Mymensingh, from May 20- May 23, 2012. The research team was split into 3-4 member groups, and took interviews of the relevant actors from the community level (community women, community health workers) to the district level (district manager, UNFPO, UNICEF field staff). In between interviews, the JPGSPH professors leading the review, **Dr. Alayne Adam**s, Professor and **Dr. Sabina Faiz Rashid**, Professor and MPH Coordinator led discussions to improve

questioning so that more relevant information could be gained from it. In addition, the research team worked on improving the questions and relevant probes so that they were more tailored to the interviewee for each tool.

FSNSP

The 7th round of data collection for the Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project (FSNSP) which started on 21 February 2012 was completed during the first week of May. During this round 9,024 households were covered in 89 upazilas.

The Mid-term review of EU- funded "Food Security component" of which Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project is a part in progress. The review team has met with key personnel of the project a number of times and also visited field to

monitor the data collection process.

The Training Officer and 8 Quality Control Officers from FSNSP provided a daylong training on 14 May 2012 to 21 Regional Statistical Officers from Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics on anthropometric measurements.

Refresher training for Round 8 data collection was held at Dhaka Ahsania Mission Auditorium from 27 May to 31 May 2012. 8 Senior Monitoring Officers, 14 Quality Control Officers, 8 Field Coordinators and 64 Data Collection Officers attended the training which was facilitated by the Field Managers and the Training Officer. Training was imparted on Anthropometric Measurements and data collection questionnaire.

FACULTY AND STAFF NEWS

Dr. Timothy Grant Evans, Dean JPGSPH Authors' Workshop, Bellagio Center, Italy, May 1-2. Dr. Evans presented a draft chapter on health development that reviews the past and projects forward in the post-MDG period. The chapter is part of a volume commissioned by the International Development Research Centre (IDRC) that is bringing together about 50 chapters reviewing development thinking and practices. As part of the meeting, a 2 hours video-conference was held with the recently appointed President of the World Bank, **Dr. Jim Kim**.

Together with **Adib Hossain** and **Fatema Rasul** of the bHIP team, spent a day at the MIA in Delhi learning about their standardized approaches to microinsurance in India, Nepal and Vietnam. **Adib** and **Fatema** stayed on to visit field sites in Bihar.

Dr. Timothy Grant Evans, Dean JPGSPH as the principal investigator of the MOVE-IT Bangladesh project attended a regional consultation of MOVE-IT partners in the Asia region. There are MOVE-IT projects in Cambodia, Indonesia, Philippines and Thailand hosted by the Health Metrics Network (HMN) of WHO. Presentations were made to the Technical Advisory Committee of the HMN. The MOVE-IT Bangladesh project received very good feedback from the Technical Advisory Group and other country partners of MOVE-IT. MOVE-IT Bangladesh will be invited to present at the special session of the Statistics Committee of the Asia

Pacific in Bangkok in December.

Dr. Timothy Grant Evans, Dean JPGSPH, and **Professor Malabika Sarkar** were lead faculty for the Asia Network for Health System Strengthening (ANHSS) short-course on strategies to engage the private sector in primary health care held at the Asia Institute of Management in Manila from May 13-19, 2012. Approximately 40 students from 12 countries attended the meeting including 7 participants from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare of Bangladesh.

Dr. Sabina Faiz Rashid, Professor and MPH Coordinator is an Adjunct Visiting Professor at the Charite, Berlin School of Public Health, Germany since 2007. In May 2012, she was invited again to teach in the Masters program on "international gender, health and society" from May 29-June 1, 2012. **Dr. Rashid** has been a visiting teaching faculty and teaches an intensive module on 'Gender, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights' for MPH students each year in the program.

JPGSPH faculty **Md. Tanvir Hasa**n taught the Biostatistics module in the Internship program for Advanced Research Methods at the Centre for Control of Chronic Diseases (CCCD), icdd,b This was a 2 week course which started on May 06, 2012 and ended on May 21, 2012.

Anuradha Hashemi, Researcher presented on JPGSPH's work in sexuality rights in Bangladesh at a workshop on "Building Gender Excellence" at Dhaka University on May 9th.
