BIGH Updates

BIGH poster won 1st runner-up prize at the Social Science Conference in Singapore



The James P. Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH) at BRAC Institute of Global Health (BIGH) presented a poster at the Health Systems in Asia Reform conference, 2013 in Singapore as part of IDRC's activity of disseminating research locally as well as globally. The poster titled "Mobilizing demand for primary health care among the urban poor in Bangladesh" won the 1st runner

up prize at this social science and Medicine conference. The conference was attended by **Dr. Sabina Faiz Rashid**, Dean and PI of the project, **Dr. Nadira Sultana Kakoly**, Research coordinator and lead author of the poster from JPGSPH. The conference helped raise awareness and share on a global scale, quality research work that is being conducted in this area.

The participants gave a lot of feedback and showed interest with opportunities for networking built through the process. The conference was held from 13th - 16th of December, 2013 in Singapore.

MPH Students participates in Data Analysis Workshop

The MPH students at James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC Institute of Global Health participated in Data Analysis Workshop on December 20, 2013. The main objective of this Data Analysis Workshop was to guide students on how to do data analysis of their Independent Field Study as per the research objective or question. The other objective was to give feedback to those students who have already analyzed data and interpreted in thesis report.

The Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project Results from Round 10 February to April 2013

The workshop was comprised of didactic lecture on data analysis as per the research method followed by a one to one feedback session. The quantitative and mixed method session was facilitated by Showkat Gani and **Dr. Enam Hasib** while the qualitative session was taken by **Prof. Sabina Faiz Rashid**.

After the didactic lecture session, students shared their data analysis and findings and invited their feedback to their work. It is worth mentioning that as per the requirement of the MPH Programme, students are required to conduct an independent field study on a particular public health issue.

FSNSP completed round-12 data collection

The Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project (FSNSP) successfully completed data collection of round-12, phase-1 on 25th November, 2013. Total 51 thanas including both Chittagong hill tracts and plain lands were covered in this round. Like all other previous rounds, data were collected using PDA and paper copy questionnaires in this round. FSNSP collects data on three major seasons in Bangladesh which are: the post-aman harvest period (February-April), monsoon period (June-August) and the post-aus harvest period (October-December) in a year. Due to unavoidable circumstances it had been decided to keep this round short. In the meantime, FSNSP has published its latest bulletin on the findings of round 10 (February-April 2013). The bulletin reveals that food insecurity as measured by Household Food Insecurity Access Scale (34%), Food Deficit Scale (10%) and Food Consumption Score (28%) was lower during Round 10 than the previous round (9).

Prevalence of child under nutrition also decreased in terms of underweight (27%), wasting (8%) and MUAC z-score (3%) compared to that of round 9. The bulletin is available at: http://sph.bracu.ac.bd/

CoEUHC published newsletter on Bangladesh Health Watch

The Centre of Excellence for Universal Health Coverage at JPGSPH of BIGH, BRAC University published a newsletter on Bangladesh Health Watch. It highlighted the UHC themes and Bangladesh preparedness for achieving UHC. Along with the theoretical concepts of UHC, the launching of Bangladesh Health Watch Report on UHC and the Lancet Series on Bangladesh: Innovation for Universal Health Coverage has been reported in this newsletter.

The first round deliverables for the project i.e. Market Survey on Discrete Choice Experiment had been shared with partner organizations based upon the consensus among the partners.

An internal meeting was held among the members of CoE-UHC on 22nd of December, 2013 at the North Meeting room of BIGH. The meeting discussed issues like the status of the projects under UHC, upcoming events, deliverables and deadlines.

The CoE-UHC members would organize and take part in a symposium entitled 'Human Resources for health in Bangladesh: current Scenario and Promising Innovations' in the 4th Regional Public Health Conference organized by BUHS.

One such priority is to overcome the common misconception that sees only certain national industries as 'top notch' and thereby saturates and limits opportunities in them. In a concerted effort to break this 'spell', CSO members visited many organizations from different industrial sectors, encouraging their participation, to truly enrich industrial representation at the Career Fair. By opening a window into the opportunities available in their sectors, organizations can encourage students to pursue their genuine interests, rather than just following 'protocol'.

Some of the organizations visited included: Betopi (Advertising) Epillion Group (RMG), Bangla Cat (Energy), bti (commercial property) and Robi (telecommunications).

Departmental enthusiasm for the Fair also came to the fore in December, with plans for seminars flowing in. Many of these aim to convey ways to further departmental-industry collaboration, to realize the expectations and career aspirations of existing (and future) students.

PSDP Update for Fall 2013

Despite unavoidable circumstances, the CSO has managed to successfully carry out the PSDP classes for Fall 2013. Although the regular classes and individual advising sessions could not be held, advisors gave students take-home

assignments and provided supervision by e-mails whenever necessary.

"Real world" experience is a key component of any career plan, which is why the CSO helps students secure internships and develop valuable networking opportunities that build confidence and help define realistic career goals.


This semester the CSO has arranged internships for more than 100 Bachelor in Business Administration (BBA) students and 40 Masters in Business Administration (MBA), 4 Economics and Social Sciences (ESS), 6 English and Humanities (ENH) and 2 Electrical and Electronic Engineering (EEE) students in a variety of organizations, according to their preferred choice of industry.

72% of the students were placed by CSO and 28% of the students arranged

internship by themselves in the semester Fall' 2013, as shown in the chart.

In Fall'13, the highest number of students were placed in the banking sector (43%), with 19% placed in telecommunications. On the other hand, less than 10% were placed in, multinationals, advertising & event management, the pharmaceutical, manufacturing, RMG, hospitality, education, development and real estate sectors.

The CSO through the Career Fair and other services like career advising aims to address this disparity and create a platform where future job-seekers will not be restricted to the 'most popular' sectors only, but will pursue their careers in other industries too.

Since the CSO is increasing representing more sectors, less students will remain jobless after their graduation as result of greater opportunities. Students can also

pursue careers in sectors that suit their interest and not just be restricted to banking or telecommunication sectors, as shown by the chart above.

Counseling Unit Updates

Sessions for Medha Bikash students:

Counseling Unit of BRAC University had been visiting the Medha Bikash, a program run by BEP (BRAC Education Program), to conduct a motivational session for the underprivileged students coming from rural and at the same time very successful academic background for last four years.

The session is usually divided into two segments. In the first segment, the expert Counselor provides a lecture at a class room setting where particular psychosocial issues are discussed. In this segment, different psychological issues like: Self confidence, acceptance, goal setting, developing positive attitude and motivation are covered. The second segment covers mainly the individual or group counseling sessions for the students who express their need for individual session.

The latest visit for Medha Bikash group was held on 25th December, 2013. This time 51 students had participated in different session. These sessions were conducted by **Anjuman Ara Eva**. The session could inspire them to realize the broader picture of what they are up to, motivated towards goal wise life setting. It was participatory and inspiring as well. ESS Updates

International Conference on Globalization and Trade organized by ESS



The Economics and Social Sciences (ESS) Department of BRAC University organized a day-long conference on "Globalization and Trade: Prospects and Challenges for South Asia" on Friday 20 December 2013. The conference brought together some of the active researchers in the field from universities, think-tank

institutes, and policy makers to brainstorm trade policy issues and challenges from globalization to regional economies. **Shamim Shakur** from Massey University in New Zealand, currently Visiting Professor of Economics, and **Farzana Munshi**, Associate Professor, organized the conference along with the ESS Economics faculty.

Professor Syed M Hashemi, Head of ESS department at BRAC University welcomed delegates in the morning. A total of 14 research papers were presented in four thematic sessions, namely: (1) Globalization and Trade in South Asia, (2) Globalization and Income Inequality, (3) Financial Aspects of Globalization and Trade and (4) Trade Policy in Bangladesh. The sessions were chaired, respectively, by **Dr. Debapriya Bhattacharya**, (CPD), **Dr. Quazi Shahabuddin**, (BIDS), **Dr. Mustafa K. Mujeri**, (BIDS) and **Professor Fahad Khalil** (University of Washington, USA). All papers were selected by a blindreview process from a larger pool of economics researchers from Bangladesh, India, Sikkim, United States, Canada, Australia and New Zealand.

In his keynote presentation delivered in the afternoon, renowned economist and former adviser to the caretaker government **Professor Wahiduddin Mahmud** emphasized cooperation among South Asian countries towards making a global trade agreement.



The conference ended with a lively panel discussion session on the conference theme, chaired by **Dr. Mustafa K Mujeri**, Director General of Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies. Other members of the distinguished panel included **Dr. Mozibur Rahman**, Chief Executive Officer at Bangladesh Foreign

Trade Institute and **Professor Mustafizur Rahman**, Executive Director, Centre for Policy Dialogue. **Professor Ainun Nishat**, Vice-Chancellor of BRAC University was among 60+ enthusiastic attendees at the conference.

IGS Launched its Annual Research Report The State of Governance in Bangladesh 2012



The launching of the State of Governance in Bangladesh 2012, the annual flagship publication of the Institute of Governance Studies (IGS), BRAC University, was held on 26 December, 2013, at The Daily Star Centre in Dhaka. Dr. Hossain Zillur Rahman, Executive Chairman of the Power and Participation Research Centre and former Advisor to the Caretaker Government was the Chief Guest of the ceremony. Dr. Sultan Hafeez Rahman, Executive Director of IGS-BDI chaired the event. **Dr. Manzoor Ahmed**, Senior Adviser, Institute of Educational Development (IED), BRAC University; Mr. Zafar Ullah Khan, former Secretary to the Ministry of Health and Professor Ataur Rahman, President of Bangladesh Political Science Association were the panel discussants of the programme. Dr. Jens Stanislawski and Dr. Ashikur Rahman, both Research Fellows and **Syeda Salina Aziz**, Senior Research Associate of IGS, presented the key findings of the report titled, The State of Governance in Bangladesh 2012: Regions, Representation, Disparity. Dr. Mahbub Hossain, Executive Director, BRAC; **Dr. Tofail Ahmed**, local government expert & UNDP Consultant; **Dr.** Ahsan H Mansur, Executive Director of Policy Research Institute; Mr. AMM Nasir Uddin, former Secretary to the Ministry of Health and Dr. Rizwan Khair, Director, IGS also spoke at the programme. Academics, researchers, experts, politicians, representatives from think tank and donor organizations, civil society members also attended the event.

The report assessed power concentration, parliamentary representation, health and education governance at the district level through a quantitative approach. The event was widely covered by print and electronic media.
