Consultation on effectiveness of safe childbirth checklist

A team of young researchers from James P. Grant School of Public Health, BRAC Institute of Global Health, BRAC University led by **Dr. Shabnam Mostari**, **Dr. Rubana Islam** and **Dr. Herfina Nababan** has received an innovative research grants from Maternal Health Task Force at the Harvard School of Public Health. The title of their study is "Making WHO safe childbirth checklist work in Bangladesh - a study to identify ways for uptake and sustained use". With this project they would like to see the effectiveness of safe childbirth checklist (SCC) established by World Health Organization (WHO) in Bangladeshi context.



An expert consultation meeting was held on 29 January 2014 at BIGH conference room. Different obstetricians, neonatologists and public health expert were present at the meeting. The main objective of the meeting was to get expert opinion on whether the Checklist would be applicable in Bangladeshi context, and in what aspect the Checklist would need to be changed and/or improved.

Dr. Shabnam Mostari, Principal Investigator of this study from James P. Grant School of Public Health presented the overall project status. **Dr. Rubana Islam**, Co-PI from icddr,b presented the checklist to get expert opinion and Prof. Malabika Sarker, the adviser of this project facilitated the sessions. WHO SCC team is currently working to incorporate the feedback from the stakeholders and make the necessary changes in preparation of the study.

REACHOUT team completes CTC context analysis

The REACHOUT Bangladesh team has successfully completed the first draft of the Context Analysis of Close-to-Community (CTC) Provider report. This report includes qualitative and quantitative research findings along with a desk review of CTC providers in Bangladesh. The report also highlights the factors which hinders the performance of such providers in rural and urban slum community settings. This would be addressed in the Quality Improvement Cycle (QIC) of the project. The report has already been shared with Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (LSTM), the coordinating partner of the REACHOUT consortium. The QIC process would begin from July, while the report would give the team additional support in developing the CTC framework for the intervention design factors and M&E tools to gain insight on the perspectives and interactions of the CTC providers and that of the community. Furthermore, REACHOUT Bangladesh team has finalized the South-South Technical Assistance Grid, which is a Milestone (MS11) to be achieved for the project in January 2014. The document will be shared and uploaded at the EC portal by the end of the month. The process of grid formation included a brainstorming session in the second REACHOUT consortium meeting at Amsterdam, The Netherlands, earlier in November 2013. The relevant partners have formed a grid placing the information on "what we can offer" as an institution and "what we need" from the REACHOUT partner countries. The document has placed out this information and the possible date for the first South-South Technical Assistance would be from March 31 2014, at the third REACHOUT consortium meeting in Mozambique.

FSNSP and BBS staffs receive basic training

The Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project (FSNSP) organized nine-day basic training during 21-30 January, 2014 for its newly recruited data collection officers (DCOs) and Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) staffs. This training mainly focused on the interview techniques on the data collection. Training on interview techniques, anthropometric measurements, use of PDAs and questionnaires was given. Training was facilitated by the

Project Coordinator, Field Managers, Senior Monitoring Officers, Quality Control Officers and Training Officer.

A total of 11 participants attended the training. BBS staffs have been jointly working with BRAC Institute of Global Health of BRAC University in this project. After completion of training, staffs have moved to the field for data collection of the first phase of round 13. The phase will be started form 06 February, 2014 which will continue till 01 March, 2014.

CEP organises short course on mainstreaming nutrition

Continuing Education Program (CEP) of James P Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH) under BRAC Institute of Global Health (BIGH) organised a 4 days training course on "Mainstreaming Nutrition in Public Health and Relevant Sectors" for the District Nutrition Support Officers' (DNSO) and Zonal Nutrition Officers' (ZNO) supported by UNICEF at the Asia Pacific Hotel from 23-26 January 2014. The objective of the course was to build capacity of DNSOs and ZNOs in order to mainstream nutrition interventions through local level government agencies and other NGOs. Nine DNSOs and 6 ZNOs were participated in the course. Welcoming the participants at the inaugural session **Dr Sabina Faiz Rasheed**, Dean of James P Grants School of Public Health also mentioned to offer such courses in the coming days.



Diverse contents were used in the course starting from current nutrition situation, existing policies, principles of mainstreaming, problem solving cycle and bottleneck analysis, communication, mentoring and on the job training (OJT), basics of managing, monitoring and reporting, understanding the data, analyze and interpretation of those for decision making to coordination roles between inter-governmental agencies and so forth. Role play, group discussion, presentation and sharing real life experiences were the main methods of learning in these sessions. A pool of experienced facilitators was involved from different ministries of GoB including UNICEF, ICDDR'B, HKI and JPGSPH.

Dr. Hedayetul Islam, Director, IPHN, MoHFW and Line Director NNS along with **Dr. Sadia Afroze Chowdhury**, Executive Director of BIGH, distributed certificates among the participants. Representatives from USAID, EU, CIDA along with other development partners were also present at the closing ceremony of the course.
