## C3ER Team Visited Barind Multipurpose Development Authority in Rajshahi

Engineer Ahsan Zakir, Executive Director of Barind Multipurpose Development Authority (BMDA) invited Professor Ainun Nishat, Vice Chancellor of BRAC University and Advisor of the Centre for Climate Change and Environmental Research (C3ER), Mr. Nandan Mukherjee, Director of C3ER and Dr. Sajidur Rahman, Coordinator – Informatics of C3ER to visit Barind project and its innovative activities. The team visited BMDA from February 27, 2014 to March 01, 2014. A seminar was held there on the activities of Barind where Professor Ainun Nishat shared few ideas regarding water management. BMDA, the largest state-owned irrigation providing organization in the country's northwest region, has taken the initiative of wide-ranging promotion of Alternate Wetting and Drying (AWD) irrigation method. As the underground water table is becoming lower, farmers in the vast Barind tract are being encouraged adopting watersaving irrigation method like AWD. They have established solar powered irrigation system at Barind Tract. They are providing buried pipe water from Padma River for irrigation leads to reduce use of ground water which results in efficient solution of irrigation problem. BMDA has conceived the method as an effort to keep the underground water table sustainable through less consumption of irrigation water.




## Amader Bari Amader Moto (Our Home Our Way)

Tag: Department of Architecture

'Pro-poor Slum Integration Project' (PPSIP), a joint effort by BRAC University, the World Bank, National Housing Authority (NHA)of Bangladesh, KMC, JA Architects and Manchester University. The objective of this project is to develop city-wide housing processes with/by/for the low-income communities.



Five towns were initially shortlisted for the pilot projects through an inception workshop in September, 2013. A team consisting representatives from the major stakeholders made extensive visits to the shortlisted towns. During the visits, the team met all the relevant city authorities like the Mayor, District Commissioner, the Town Manager from the UPPR project and community leaders to assess the willingness of the city authorities and the networking between the communities around the city. Based on the findings, Comilla was selected as the first city for thepilot program.

In the second phase, the consultant team from BRAC University is currently visiting existing communities intensively to select five communities to implement one of each interventions of insitu upgrading, re-blocking, land-sharing and voluntary re-settlement. Grounding on the suggestions from the existing community network in the city, the team has already visited around 130 communities and made a prioritized list of 10 communities to initiate a city-wide network of communities that are relatively readier for the interventions. This city-wide network will be consisted of four other sub-networks centering on the contextual needs of specific areas of Comilla City.

Besides visiting the communities and meeting with community leaders, the team is also sharing their work process simultaneously with the city authorities and other partner organizations through workshops and meetings.

In the third phase, the social survey team and environment team will carry out detailed census in all of the 10 communities before the team of Community Architects finally starts working with the first five of the prioritized list of communities for the pilot project.

#### **BRAC International Young Professional's Training**

Conducted jointly by the Economics and Social Sciences Department and the Center for Entrepreneurship Development, BRAC University

**Professor Syed M Hashemi**, in collaboration with **Professor Rezaur Razzak** (Center for Entrepreneurship Development) launched an eight week training program for BRAC International Young Professionals. These young fast-track management recruits came from Pakistan and several countries in Sub-Saharan Africa. The training program was intended to provide them with a broad overview of development issues, management skills, conceptual clarity and the communications competency necessary to address the complex problem solving challenges of BRAC International. The training program focused on:

- business management
- awareness of development issues
- effective communications
- an appreciation of and sensitivity to the lives of the poor and the powerless, especially women

The training started at early February and would be continuing till the end of April, with a four week field immersion.

Professor Syed M Hashemi Co-organizes the Global Learning Event on Graduation in Paris



In Paris February 19-21, over 100 leading policymakers, practitioners, and development experts gathered for the 'Reaching the Poorest Global Learning Event 2014' to look at what we've learned so far from implementation and research on the Graduation Program, launched by CGAP and the Ford Foundation in 2006. **Professor Syed M Hashemi** had been one of the principal coordinators of this program -- a global effort to understand how safety nets, livelihoods and access to finance can be sequenced to create sustainable pathways for the poorest out of extreme poverty. **Dean Karlan** from Yale University, **Robin Burgess** from LSE and **Anasuya Sengupta** (ex researcher at the BRAC Development Institute) presented Randomized Control Trial findings and qualitative research findings suggesting significant proof of the graduation model. A major focus of the event was the participation of a large number of senior policy makers from different countries and development agencies who examined how the Graduation Approach could be incorporated into national and social protection policies in order to reach the extreme poor on a large scale.

**Sir Fazle Hasan Abed** was the key note speaker at the event which also included participants from BRAC and BRAC USA.

The Institute of Governance Studies (IGS) in collaboration with Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industries (CCCI) organized a roundtable discussion titled 'Urban Governance in Chittagong: Problems and Prospects' on 26th February 2014 at CCCI Conference Hall, Chittagong. The discussion was organized with regards to the upcoming IGS State of Cities report, which will be based on Chittagong. IGS Research Fellow **M Shahidul Islam** made a keynote presentation on governance issues concerning the geography of Chittagong, the city's development constraints and possible urban operating model, focusing on how Chittagong can be made livable and economically potential for the growth of Bangladesh. The event was chaired by Mahbubul Alam, President, CCCI.

The participants at the roundtable included members of CCCI, service providers of Chittagong city, academics, professionals, politicians, consumer association, journalists and students and team of researchers from IGS including **Mohammad Sirajul Islam** and **Nabila Zaman**. The discussion session brought forward governance aspects of Chittagong City from where a key observation included lack of coordination among the city governing bodies, notably, Chittagong Development Association (CDA) and Chittagong City Corporation. Concerns were also raised by majority participants on lack of proper public service provisions (gas, water, sewage, communication). The event was widely covered by the print media in Chittagong and Dhaka.

## **Cinema and Border Crossing: Women Filmmakers in the Subcontinent**

The February session of ENH Seminar Series featured **Dr. Esha Niyogi De's** talk titled "Cinema and Border Crossing: Women Filmmakers in the Subcontinent". The talk was held on February 24 in GDLN conference room.

**Dr. De** is a Fulbright Senior Multi-Country Scholar teaching at UCLA and researching cinema by women filmmakers of Bangladesh, Pakistan and India. She discussed the factors contributing to the empowerment of women film-makers (both directors and producers) in India, Bangladesh and Pakistan as contrasted with the Hollywood film industry.



Though women are traditionally portrayed as stereotypical images or objects typifying Laura Mulvey's idea of scopophilia, women directors are challenging that tradition. For example, in Aparna Sen's Paroma, she exploits voyeurism to critique the problems women face when they are supervised by male directors and the ways in which complacent Hindu middle class spectators become active participants of the patriarchal system. So, women directors and producers are working through a male-gaze-centered cinematic system to challenge the objectification of women, and they are not only crossing geographical borders but also those of patriarchal voyeurism.

# Field-visit of C3ER Team in Borguna and Pirojpur District to Identify the Source and Quality of Water

C3ER organized a field visit for the project titled "Access to Safe Drinking Water in Coastal Areas of Bangladesh" in greater Borguna and Pirojpur district On February 22, 2014. Mr. Nandan Mukherjee, A S Moniruzzaman Khan, Roufa Khanum, and Minhaz Farid Ahmed visited entire study area, conducted focus group discussion among the target group and prepared a resource and water source mapping. Afterward, Minhaz Farid Ahmed coordinated the entire field study. The objectives of the this visit was to identify the source of water supply in the selected districts representing the coastal areas of the country, assess the pattern of water use from different sources, and identify the impacts of anthropogenic actions on water quality. To satisfy the objectives, the field visit was designed for detail water point and household survey to identify different sources of drinking water. The representative household for questionnaire survey in the study villages was identified by considering the vulnerability in terms of access to safe drinking water and the GPS location of these household was collected in order to produce map of the study villages and the sources of drinking water e.g. tube-wells, ponds, dug-wells, canals, rivers, etc. in the study area were identified through GPS. During the seven days field visit, data were collected on water source that was taking place from the mentioned coastal areas. However, it was evident that, most of the household does not have sufficient safe source of drinking water. In addition, availability of saline and iron in the water, insufficient tube wells, improper maintenance and/or unavailability of Pond Sand Filter (PSF) and other vital issues that results in health hazard diseases like Diarrhea.
