Over the course of a year the project got thoroughly revised and refined involving prototyping, small scale piloting, and feasibility studies. The idea was selected in top 10 and all the participants had to pitch for public voting through social media and BTV. The grand finale will be telecast by BTV on 21st January 8.35 Team Resurgence competed in HULT Prize regional round in Shanghai in March 2017 where they came second among 64 teams from universities around the world.
