

Former WHO official to lead BRAC Univ's school of public health

Former assistant director-general of WHO Dr Timothy G Evans will lead BRAC University's school of public health from July 1.

Dr Evans has been appointed dean of James P Grant School of Public health of BRAC University, says a press release of the university.

He will be seconded to BRAC University from ICCDR,B as a senior strategic adviser on knowledge translation.

A Canadian national, Dr Evans received his medical degree from McMaster University and trained at Brigham and Women's Hospital at Harvard University. He received his doctorate on Agricultural Economics from Oxford University.

Previously he worked as an assistant professor of international health economics at the Harvard School of Public health and as a director of the health equity at the Rockefeller Foundation.
